WHAT HAPPENS WHEN YOU MIX ICE STORM, 300,000 TREES, HYDRO LINES, CHRISTMAS VACATION, AND A GTA-WIDE EMERGENCY: THE PERFECT STORM. OVER 20,000 CUSTOMERS WERE WITHOUT POWER INCLUDING A NUMBER OF CITY FACILITIES, STREETS LITTERED WITH BRANCHES SO EMERGENCY VEHICLES COULDN'T GET THROUGH, 3-1-1 CALLS JUMPED FROM 350 NORMAL VOLUME TO OVER 6,000 IN ONE DAY, VOLUNTEER RESOURCES IN THE GTA WERE STRETCHED BEYOND NORMAL CAPACITY, AND MANY STAFF MEMBERS WERE OUT OF THE COUNTRY. IN THE END, AN EVALUATION TEAM FROM THE PROVINCE TOURED ALL 19 MUNICIPALITIES AFFECTED BY THE ICE STORM AND CONFIRMED THAT THE CITY OF BRAMPTON HAD BEEN THE HARDEST HIT IN THE GTA. YET, AFTER LESS THAN THREE WEEKS, THE SITUATION WAS GENERALLY CONTAINED. HOW DID THE CITY OF BRAMPTON DO THIS?

TRENDING NOW ARE "SOCIAL MEDIA" AND "SOCIAL MARKETING," BUT THE TERMS ARE OFTEN CONFUSED AND MANY DEPARTMENTS FACE LIMITATIONS ON THE USE OF "SOCIAL MEDIA" SITES (SUCH AS FACEBOOK AND TWITTER).
